


FINISH

You and your new penguin friend live happily ever after!




This penguin could be the one for you. You need to wait a bit longer to find out.

Leopard Seals! One of your enemies. **MOVE BACK 5 SPACES** as you escape.


You might be near-sighted on land, but you can see very well in the water. That killer whale in the distance is avoided.

It's cold, but all that blubber and those tightly packed feathers keep you warm.




Safely back on the ice. **THROW AGAIN** as you playfully slip and slide in happiness.


The shape of your body helps you swim at high speeds and you escape from the shark, jumping out of the water.

It's not only fish you like to eat, but crab and squid are also delicious to you.




Time moves on and you're now old enough to swim alone and find fish for yourself.

<p>An icy wind blows in from the sea. GO BACK 2 SPACES</p>	<p>Delicious fish! The <i>regurgitation</i> added something... MOVE FORWARD 2 SPACES.</p>	<p>Your mama brought back into her mouth the fish she ate already. It's called <i>regurgitation</i>. Because you're a penguin you don't care.</p>	<p>Your mama just brought you some fish. Yummy! THROW AGAIN.</p>

RULES: A player pretends to be a penguin and rolls a die! S/he moves that number of spaces on the board. If the square has instructions on it, the students must move forward, back, throw again or miss a turn as per the command. Throw the exact number to finish the game.

Your wing will do fine.</p>	<p>The cold is troubling you even though penguins are born with fluffy feathers. MISS A TURN</p>

<p>You're still in an egg! THROW A 1 OR HIGHER to be born!</p>	<p>Poor penguins! They look so klutzy! Waddling on the ice, slipping and sliding. Penguins look like they're about to fall over any time. Their wide, three toed feet close to their tail are the cause of the waddle. Let's join the penguins as they move through their natural habitat, feed and avoid predators in this fight for survival board game.</p>
